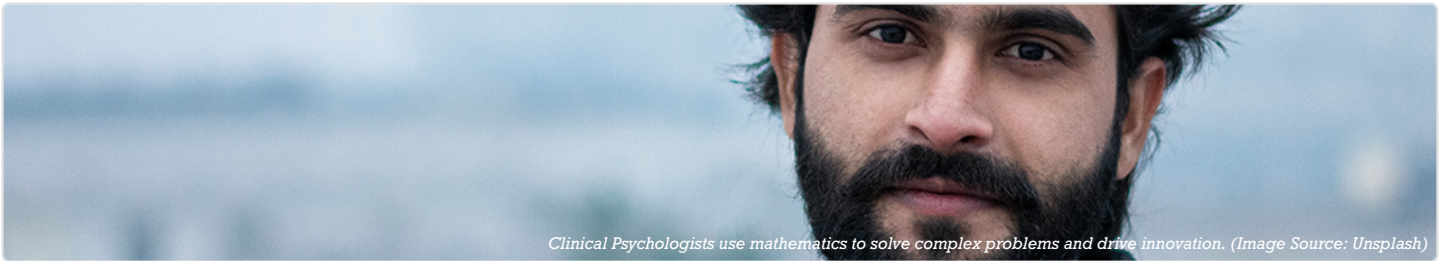


CAREERS THROUGH MATHS: CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGIST

JOB OVERVIEW

Clinical Psychologists in the UK work at the intersection of mental health science and human behaviour, applying rigorous psychological principles to assess, diagnose, and treat individuals experiencing psychological distress. Based primarily within the National Health Service (NHS), clinical psychologists work across a variety of settings including NHS Trusts, community mental health teams, hospitals, prisons, and specialist clinics. A typical working day might involve conducting cognitive assessments, designing bespoke treatment programmes, delivering evidence-based therapies such as Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT), and writing detailed formulation reports for multidisciplinary teams.
