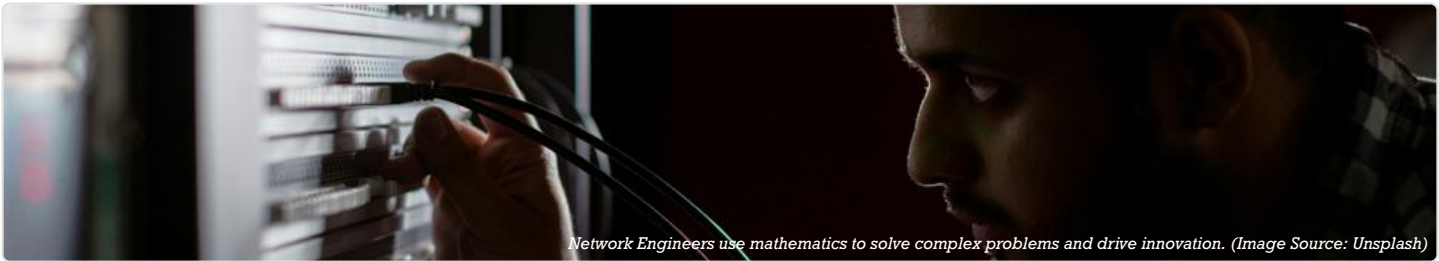


Careers Through Maths: Network Engineer

Job Overview

A Network Engineer is responsible for designing, implementing, managing, and troubleshooting the computer networks that underpin modern business and public services in the UK. Their daily work involves configuring routers and switches from vendors like Cisco and Juniper, ensuring secure connectivity across multiple office locations, and maintaining robust links to data centres and cloud platforms such as Microsoft Azure or Amazon Web Services. They work in a variety of environments, from the server rooms of financial institutions in the City of London to the network operation centres (NOCs) of major telecommunications providers like BT or Virgin Media O2, often as part of a larger IT team. Key duties are deeply analytical and require precision.
