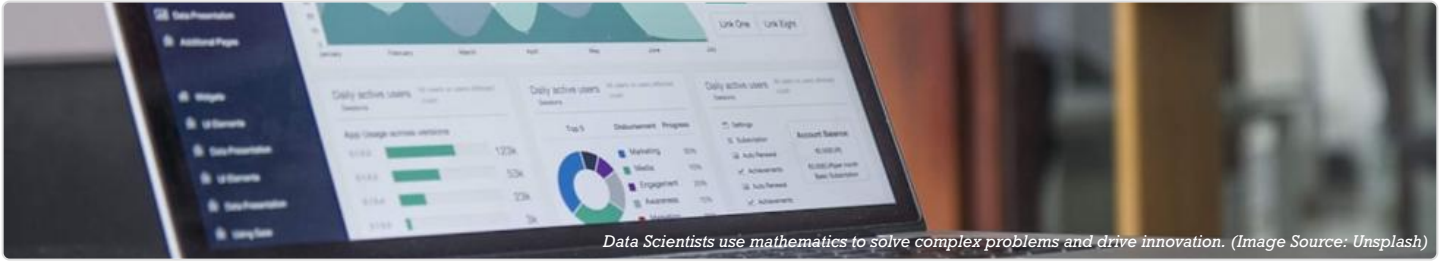


CAREERS THROUGH MATHS: DATA SCIENTIST

JOB OVERVIEW

A Data Scientist in the UK transforms raw data into actionable intelligence for organisations ranging from London’s fintech giants like Revolut and Monzo to the NHS’s analytics units and retail powerhouses such as Tesco and Ocado. Your typical week might involve wrangling millions of rows of transactional data to identify customer churn patterns, building predictive models to forecast energy demand for National Grid, or designing A/B testing frameworks to optimise the user journey on a government digital service like GOV.UK. The work is project-based, often operating in agile sprints, and you will liaise closely with software engineers, product managers, and board-level stakeholders who rely on your mathematical rigour to make evidence-based decisions.

Primary Areas:

- **Probability and Statistics:** ** This is the bedrock of your daily work. You will use Bayesian inference to update the probability of a customer defaulting on a loan at Barclays as new...
- **Linear Algebra:** ** Every recommendation system, from Netflix to Spotify’s UK operations, relies on matrix factorisation. You will represent user-item interactions as sparse...
- **Calculus and Optimisation:** ** Training any machine learning model involves minimising a cost function, a process driven by differential calculus.

TYPICAL PATHWAY

The journey typically begins with strong GCSEs in Mathematics (grade 6 or above) and English, followed by A-level Mathematics (essential) and Further Mathematics (highly recommended). Most UK Data Scientists hold a bachelor’s degree in Mathematics, Statistics, Computer...
