An Operations Manager is the linchpin of an organisation, responsible for overseeing, designing, and controlling the process of production and redesigning business operations in the production of goods or services. In the UK, this role is critical across a diverse range of sectors, from manufacturing and logistics (e.g., at DHL or Jaguar Land Rover) to retail (e.g., Tesco's supply chain) and the NHS, where they manage clinical pathways and resource allocation. Their primary objective is to ensure that operations are efficient, cost-effective, and meet the highest quality and safety standards, all while aligning with the strategic goals of the British business. On a daily basis, an Operations Manager's duties are multifaceted.
